

Auction Committee Report

Have you "Saved the Date in the Lone Star State"? The Convention is just a few short weeks away and it's time for the Havana Auction and purchasing those new bloodlines that you've been thinking about all year or at least since you got home from the Spring Nationals.

The Havana Auction is a perfect place to purchase those Havanas and/or support the National Havana club. Proceeds from the Havana Auction are split 50/50 between the Havana RBA and the seller. In previous auctions, a few sellers have donated their half to help support the Havana Youth Scholarship fund. This is perfectly acceptable and always appreciated.

We will continue the same format for the Have a Havana Auction as we did last year. There will be a limit on the total number of rabbits allowed in the Auction, the number that each exhibitor may put in each variety and only one buck per variety/per exhibitor. Also, we will continue with the one-way traffic.

Please note, as long as you move in the same direction, you are welcome to skip past any rabbit or go ahead of others who are looking/handling rabbits/varieties that you may not be interested in. I've had a chance to speak with the convention crew in charge of take down and removal of the

showroom equipment. Hopefully, we won't have too much trouble finding a spot to hold the auction.

The Auction will be on Tuesday, Nov. 4th. Time will be posted during the convention.



Auction Guidelines:

-Sellers Limit: 2 rabbits per variety per exhibitor. Not more than 1 buck per variety. No limit on does.

Auction Limit: There will be a limit of 24 Havana. Additionally there will be a limit of 6 rabbits per variety (6 Black, 6 Blue, 6 Chocolate and 6 Broken). Slots will be filled on a first come basis.

- We ask that you not place DQ'd rabbits in the auction. Sick rabbits will be asked to be removed from the Auction viewing area.

-Seller has the right to set a minimum bid on each entry.

-All rabbits must have a full, 3 generation, pedigree that must be presented to the auction committee before the start of the auction. Accumulated leg/legs, Registration and Grand

Champion paperwork, etc. are also nice to have with the pedigree if possible.

- If there is any information that you would like the auctioneer to say about your Havana during the auction, i.e. how it placed in the show/shows, or if they are related to a particular rabbit, etc., please add a note with the pedigree.

-Each rabbit/pedigree must be accompanied by a completed sales slip.

-Youth rabbits placed in the Auction need to be marked so that buyers know to pick them up in the Youth Havana area during check-out.

-Deadline to declare an auction rabbit is Monday, Nov. 3rd, 6 p.m.

If you plan to place a rabbit/rabbits in the auction, you can reserve your slot ASAP (shoot me an email or text) or any time before Monday, Nov. 3rd, 6 p.m. During the convention, we have coop tags (and zip ties) available for rabbits that have been declared for the auction.


